With music and lyrics by Laurence O'Keefe and Nell Benjamin, the production finally made its way to the West End and opened in January 2010 at the Savoy

Theatre. The West End production was nominated for five Laurence Olivier Awards and won three, including the Best New Musical award.

Everybody's Talking About Jamie is a 2017 hit musical with music by Dan Gillespie Sells and book and lyrics by Tom MacRae. The musical was inspired by the 2011 BBC Three documentary Jamie: Drag Queen at 16.

The musical premiered at the Crucible Theatre, Sheffield on 13 February 2017. The musical then transferred over to the West End at the Apollo Theatre from 6 November 2017 and is currently touring across the country. It became an instant hit and was nominated for 5 Olivier Awards including Best New Musical, which it win!

The story begins when Jamie New a sixteen year old lad who lives on a council estate in Sheffield, doesn't quite fit in with mainstream environment.

Jamie is terrified about the future but know he wants and is going to be a sensation!

Supported by his brilliantly loving mum and surrounded by his friends, Jamie overcomes prejudice, beats the bullies and steps out of the darkness, into the spotlight.
